The New Hampshire Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Association is planning a slightly smaller virtual Ceremony for 2021, with a limited number of Committee Members present to honor New Hampshire's Fallen Law Enforcement Officers. Unfortunately, due to pandemic guidelines, and to ensure the safety and health of participants, this year's Ceremony will not be open for personal attendance by family, friends or the general public.

The Roll of Honor will be read and uniformed Committee Members will place a flower in the star wreath to remember and recognize New Hampshire's Fallen Heroes who made the ultimate sacrifice and died in the line of duty while protecting and serving the citizens of the State of New Hampshire.

Our goal is to honor our Fallen Heroes, without placing families, friends and the general public at a health risk. Sacrifices of survivors that have been left behind are consistently remembered, we recognize that many survivors are still continuing with their healing and grieving process.
